the arm of the LORD been revealed to?

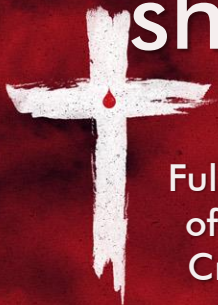

# Isaiah 53:2 (HCSB)

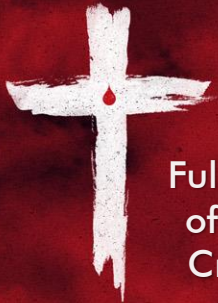
2 He grew up before Him

# Isaiah 53:3 (HCSB)

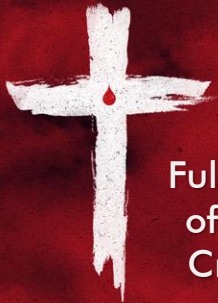

# Isaiah 53:4 (HCSB)

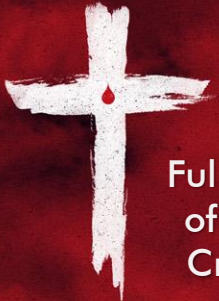
<sup>4</sup> Yet He Himself bore our sicknesses,

# Isaiah 53:5 (HCSB)

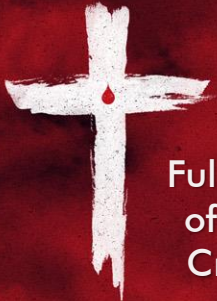
<sup>5</sup> But He was pierced because of our transgressions, crushed because of our iniquities; punishment for our peace was on Him, and we are healed by His wounds.

# Isaiah 53:6 (HCSB)

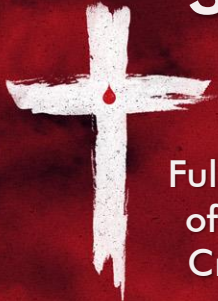
<sup>6</sup> We all went astray like sheep; we all have turned to our own way; and the LORD has punished Him for the iniquity of us all.

# Isaiah 53:7 (HCSB)

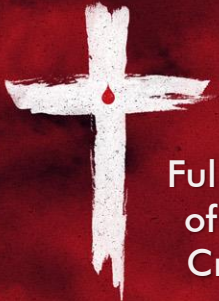
7 He was oppressed and afflicted, yet

# Isaiah 53:8 (HCSB)

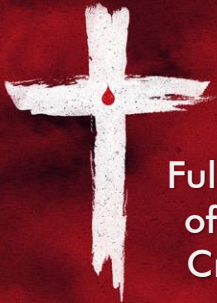
<sup>8</sup> He was taken away because of oppression and judgment; and who considered His fate? For He was cut off from the land of the living; He was struck because of my people's rebellion.

<sup>9</sup> They made His grave with the wicked and with a rich man at His death, although He had done no violence and had not spoken deceitfully.

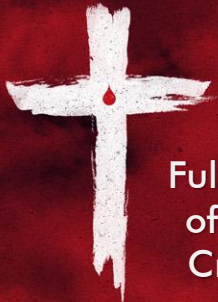

# Isaiah 53:10 (HCSB)

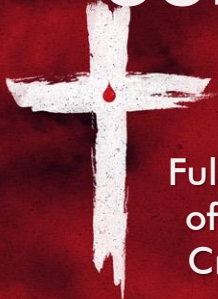

# Isaiah 53:11 (HCSB)

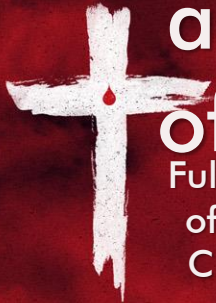
<sup>11</sup> He will see [it] out of His anguish,
