



John 6:22 (NASB)

The next day the crowd that stood on the other side of the sea saw that there was no other small boat there, except one, and that Jesus had not entered with His disciples into the boat, but that His disciples had gone away alone.

John 6:23 (NASB)

There came other small boats from Tiberias near to the place where they ate the bread after the Lord had given thanks.

John 6:24 (NASB)

So when the crowd saw that Jesus was not there, nor His disciples, they themselves got into the small boats, and came to Capernaum seeking Jesus.

John 6:25 (NASB)

When they found Him on the other side of the sea, they said to Him, "Rabbi, when did You get here?"



John 6:26 (NASB)

Jesus answered them and said, "Truly, truly, I say to you, you seek Me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate of the loaves and were filled.

John 6:27 (NASB) "Do not work for the food which perishes, but for the food which endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give to you, for on Him the Father, God, has set His seal."

John 6:28 (NASB)

Therefore they said to Him, "What shall we do, so that we may work the works of God?"



John 6:29 (NASB)

Jesus answered and said to them, "This is the work of God, that you believe in Him whom He has sent."



John 6:30 (NASB)

So they said to Him, "What then do You do for a sign, so that we may see, and believe You? What work do You perform?



John 6:31 (NASB)

"Our fathers ate the manna in the wilderness; as it is written, 'HE GAVE THEM BREAD OUT OF HEAVEN TO EAT."



John 6:32 (NASB)

Jesus then said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, it is not Moses who has given you the bread out of heaven, but it is My Father who gives you the true bread out of heaven.

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Questions

- 1. What is your favorite type of bread to eat? Why?
- 2. Why is it so easy to get caught up "feeding" on the physical bread of life as opposed to "feeding" on the spiritual bread of life, which is Jesus?
- 3. Evaluate how you use your resources of time, money and energy. What needs in your life do you work hardest at meeting? What steps can you take to bring more balance in your life?
- 4. Why are the crowds still searching for Jesus? How does Jesus' response to their question show the difference between his interests and theirs?

- 5. What is the main reason you follow Jesus?
- 6. How would you describe your daily spiritual diet: Junk food? Frozen food? Baby food? TV microwave food? Leftovers? Meat and potatoes? Pure bread and wine?
- 7. How can we help unbelievers to see that their main need is for eternal life, not for temporal goods or pleasures?
- 8. Some people argue that James 2:14-26 proves that we must add our works to faith in order to be saved. How would you answer them in light of John 6:29?

Questions (continued)

9. Pastor Randy quoted in his point #4 that Christianity and the true bread is about Jesus, a Person. He shared the following verses. What does Philippians 1:21 mean to you in light of the sermon this last Sunday and how you live for and experience Jesus?

Philippians 1:21-23 (NASB) 21 For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain. 22 But if I am to live on in the flesh, this will mean fruitful labor for me; and I do not know which to choose. 23 But I am hard-pressed from both directions, having the desire to depart and be with Christ, for that is very much better;
