#### John 9:1 (NASB)

#### <sup>1</sup> As He passed by, He saw a man blind from birth.

#### John 9:2 (NASB)

<sup>2</sup> And His disciples asked Him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he would be born blind?"

#### John 9:3 (NASB)

<sup>3</sup> Jesus answered, "It was neither that this man sinned, nor his parents; but it was so that the works of God might be displayed in him.

#### John 9:4 (NASB)

<sup>4</sup> "We must work the works of Him who sent Me as long as it is day; night is coming when no one can work.

#### John 9:5 (NASB)

# <sup>5</sup> "While I am in the world, I am the Light of the world."

#### John 9:6 (NASB)

<sup>6</sup> When He had said this, He spat on the ground, and made clay of the spittle, and applied the clay to his eyes,

#### John 9:7 (NASB)

<sup>7</sup> and said to him, "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam" (which is translated, Sent). So he went away and washed, and came back seeing.

<sup>8</sup> Therefore the neighbors, and those who previously saw him as a beggar, were saying, "Is not this the one who used to sit and beg?"

<sup>9</sup> Others were saying, "This is he," still others were saying, "No, but he is like him." He kept saying, "I am the one."

#### John 9:10 (NASB)

<sup>10</sup> So they were saying to him, "How then were your eyes opened?"

#### John 9:11 (NASB)

<sup>11</sup> He answered, "The man who is called Jesus made clay, and anointed my eyes, and said to me, 'Go to Siloam and wash'; so I went away and washed, and I received sight." I Once Was Blind/

<sup>35</sup> Jesus heard that they had put him out, and finding him, He said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?"

#### John 9:36 (NASB) <sup>36</sup> He answered, "Who is He, Lord, that I may believe in Him?"

#### John 9:37 (NASB)

<sup>37</sup> Jesus said to him, "You have both seen Him, and He is the one who is talking with you."

#### John 9:38 (NASB)

<sup>38</sup> And he said, "Lord, I believe." And he worshiped Him.

#### John 9:39 (NASB)

<sup>39</sup> And Jesus said, "For judgment I came into this world, so that those who do not see may see, and that those who see may become blind."

#### John 9:40 (NASB)

<sup>40</sup> Those of the Pharisees who were with Him heard these things and said to Him, "We are not blind too, are we?"

#### John 9:41 (NASB)

<sup>41</sup> Jesus said to them, "If you were blind, you would have no sin; but since you say, 'We see,' your sin remains.

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# 9 Statements About Healing # 1 Jesus came to heal the whole person.

Healing in the Atonement Isaiah 53:4-6; Matthew 8:16,17; I Peter 2:24; 3 John 2

# Not all sickness is due to being punished for sin.

Job 1 & 2; Luke 13:1-5; John 9:2-3

Jesus did not come to make all people healthy and wealthy physically, but He did come to make all people healthy and wealthy spiritually.

Ephesians 1:3 John 10:10 Matthew 1:21 Luke 4:18,19

# There is a dynamic link between the spiritual life and the physical body.

We are a whole being, not compartmentalized. Sin can affect us physically. Deut 28; Dealing with sin will sometimes bring restoration physically. Psalm 32:1-11

# There is no formula for being healed physically.

# There are common components for being healed spiritually.

Jesus' Name & Presence, the preaching of the Gospel – (Jesus Christ and the cross, the blood, the resurrection), repentance confession, body of Christ, prayer, faith, James 5:13-16

# In all sickness and suffering, God desires to demonstrate His compassion, power and glory.

Look for Him! Genesis 50:20; Romans 8:28 Matthew 9:35-38 God takes our junk, our tragedies, and transforms them "Our ultimate aim in life is not be healthy, wealthy, prosperous, or problem free. (continued next slide)

Our ultimate aim in life is to bring glory to God. So would you start praising God for your "thorns" and limitations and handicaps and suffering and "heat," asking Him to open your eyes to the opportunity He has given you to display His glory and character in your life?" - Anne Graham Lotz

"Suffering may be someone's fault or it may not be anyone's fault. But if given to God, our suffering becomes an opportunity to experience the power of God at work in our lives and give glory to Him.

# Jesus' kingdom is not of this world. Though He cares for you physically. He is highly concerned for you spiritually.

Jesus' kingdom is not of this world (John 18:36). Though He cares for all of your details and life, He is highly concerned for the health of your spiritual life. John' 5:14; 8:11; 9:35-41

## Healing is clothed with mystery. God heals, but not all are healed in this life.

Though the previous statements are true, they can't be placed into a formula. Job asked God over 15 "Why's" in the book of Job, and God never answered all his "Whys." He did reveal Himself to Job and Job's faith deepened and He did heal Job (Job 42). But Job went through great trials, sickness and suffering. And he was the most righteous man on the earth at that time. Job 1 & 2.
