 - o To demonstrate to the crowd He was God's Son.

 - o Jesus' words, "I am the resurrection and the life."
 - o The anticipation of seeing Jesus after I die.
 - o That Jesus is in control.
 - o The anticipation of seeing my loved ones in heaven.
 - o The 'new body' I will have in heaven.
 - o Being carried up by angels to glory.

 - o Alive but still wrapped with grave clothes.
