Questions:

- 1. What has been your experience with gardening?
- 2. Read Isaiah 5:1-7 and Psalm 80:8-18. How do these verses shed light on what Jesus is saying about Himself as the 'true vine' (John 15:1)?
- 3. Non-Abiding Branches "There are two main explanations of John 15:6. 1) the 'throwing out' and 'burning' refer to God's temporary chastisement of the fruitless Christian and represent the 'wood, hay, and straw' of 1 Corinthians 3:9-15, or 2) the fruitless branches are like the weeds of Matthew 13:24-30,36-43; they are counterfeit Christians. Which interpretation is the more meaningful to you?"

Questions (continued)

- 4. Can a person be a Christian and not bear any fruit at all, according to this chapter?
- 5. What do the following verses teach about being made 'clean because of the word' (John 15:3)?

Psalm 119:9-11

John 12:48

Ephesians 5:26

- 6. Can you tell of a time recently when you were made 'clean' by a specific verse of Scripture?
- 7. The Father prunes fruitful branches to make them more fruitful (Jn 15:2). In what ways have you experienced the Father's 'pruning,' and what were the results?

Questions (continued)

- 8. How intimate is the relationship of the believer to Jesus, according to the figure of vine and branch?
- There are three categories described in this passage those bearing no fruit, those bearing some fruit, and those bearing much fruit. In which category would you place yourself, and why?
- 10. In what way does this 'prove' our discipleship? Or, looking at it the other way, what does our example of fruitlessness prove or reveal about us (John 15:8)?
- 11. What are some specific things you can do to deepen your relationship with Jesus?

Questions (continued)

- 12. Jesus says in Jn 15:5-8 that apart from Him the disciples can do nothing. How would that be a challenge and a comfort in view of His impending departure?
- 13. In the metaphor of the vine, what dangers / temptations do you think Jesus might have been addressing by His strong admonitions to abide in Him in John 15:6?
- 14. Apart from Jesus we can do nothing. How have you experienced the reality of this in your own Christian life?
- 15. How do we 'abide' in Him? What does this look like in practice? What does it mean to abide or remain in Christ?
