



Questions

1. Read the entire story of Lazarus, Martha and Mary in John 11:1-46? What in the story impacts or speaks to you?

Use the following scripture to discuss Questions 2 and 3

1 Corinthians 15:20-26 (NASB)

2. How do you understand the reality of being in Adam and what we experience from being a descendant of his (contemplate and discuss the sin, condemnation, and death we received from Adam's decision in the garden)
3. How do you understand the reality of those who are born again and in Jesus Christ and what we experience as being children of God (consider and discuss righteousness, justification, and life because of being in Christ?)
4. What do you think about the first resurrection mentioned in Revelation 20:1-6 (This is dealing with the millennium and particularly from the premillennial view of Christ's literal reign on earth as coming King).

Questions (continued)

5. We all understand the first physical death that we have seen occur all around us. But the second death is not as well grasped or known. How would you explain the "second death" to someone from these passages?

Revelation 2:11 (NASB) 'He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches. He who overcomes will not be hurt by the second death.'

Revelation 20:6 (NASB) Blessed and holy is the one who has a part in the first resurrection; over these the second death has no power, but they will be priests of God and of Christ and will reign with Him for a thousand years.

Revelation 20:14-15 (NASB) 14 Then death and Hades were thrown into the lake of fire. This is the second death, the lake of fire. 15 And if anyone's name was not found written in the book of life, he was thrown into the lake of fire.

Revelation 21:8 (NASB) "But for the cowardly and unbelieving and abominable and murderers and immoral persons and sorcerers and idolaters and all liars, their part will be in the lake that burns with fire and brimstone, which is the second death."

Questions (continued)

6. How do the following verses from Hebrews encourage you about your own future death experience?

Hebrews 2:9 (NASB) But we do see Him who was made for a little while lower than the angels, namely, Jesus, because of the suffering of death crowned with glory and honor, so that by the grace of God He might taste death for everyone.

Hebrews 2:14-15 (NASB) 14 Therefore, since the children share in flesh and blood, He Himself likewise also partook of the same, that through death He might render powerless him who had the power of death, that is, the devil, 15 and might free those who through fear of death were subject to slavery all their lives.

7. How does the fact that Jesus Christ, who has conquered death and sin and the grave for all those in Christ Jesus, enable you to have hope as you face “little deaths” or trials in life?
