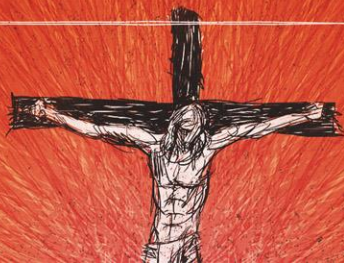

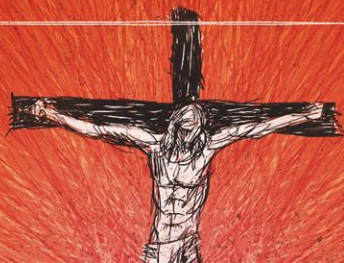

1 Peter 3:18 (NLT2) ¹⁸ Christ suffered for our sins once for all time. He never sinned, but he died for sinners to bring you safely home to God. He suffered physical death, but he was raised to life in the Spirit.

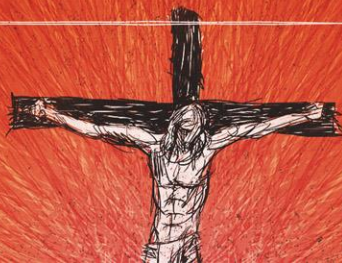

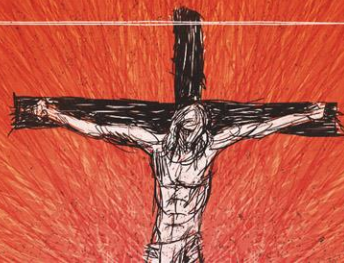

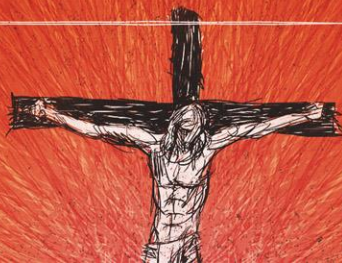

The Gospel of Jesus Christ

Problem of Sin: Romans 3:23 (NASB) for all have sinned and fall short of the glory

Penalty of Sin: Romans 6:23 (NASB) For the wages of sin is death but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

God's Provision: Romans 5:8 (NASB) But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.

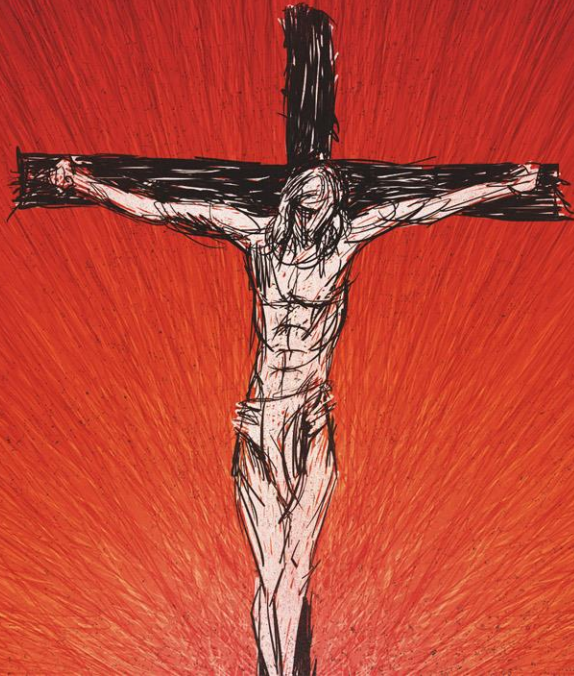
Repentance: Romans 2:4 (NASB) Or do you think lightly of the riches of His kindness and tolerance and patience, not knowing that the kindness of God leads you to repentance?

Believe in Jesus Christ: Romans 10:9,13 (NASB) ⁹ that if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved; ¹³ for "Whoever will call on the name of the Lord will be saved."

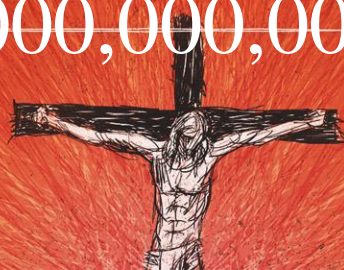

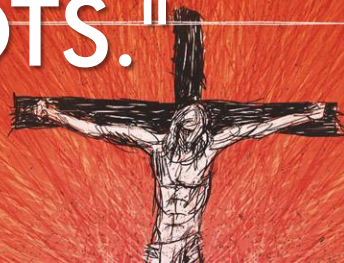


23 Then the soldiers, when they had crucified Jesus, took His outer garments and made four parts, a part to every soldier and *also* the tunic; now the tunic was seamless, woven in one piece.



John 19:23 (NASB)

24 So they said to one another, "Let us not tear it, but cast lots for it, to decide whose it shall be"; *this* was to fulfill the Scripture: "THEY DIVIDED MY OUTER GARMENTS AMONG THEM, AND FOR MY CLOTHING THEY CAST LOTS."



John 19:24 (NASB)

28 After this, Jesus, knowing that all things had already been accomplished, to fulfill the Scripture, *said, "I am thirsty."



John 19:28 (NASB)

32 So the soldiers came, and broke the legs of the first man and of the other who was crucified with Him;

33 but coming to Jesus, when they saw that He was already dead, they did not break His legs.

29 A jar full of sour wine was standing there; so they put a sponge full of the sour wine upon a *branch of hyssop* and brought it up to His mouth.



John 19:29 (NASB)

21 Then Moses called for all the elders of Israel and said to them, "Go and take for yourselves lambs according to your families, and slay the Passover *lamb*.

22 "You shall take a bunch of hyssop and dip it in the blood which is in the basin, and apply some of the blood that is in the basin to the lintel and the two doorposts; and none of you shall go outside the door of his house until morning.
