- 9. In what practical ways can we carry out Jesus' commission to 'forgive' and 'retain' sins (John 20:23) that is, to extend Jesus' forgiveness to others, while yet warning the world that sin is a serious, deadly disease?
- 10. 'As the Father has sent me, I am sending you' (John 20:21). What does this comparison tell you about the mission Jesus has given to His followers?
