Biblical Rationale of Giving

• Giving releases money's power (I Timothy 6:6-10)

1 Timothy 6:6-10 (NASB) 6 But godliness actually is a means of great gain when accompanied by contentment. 7 For we have brought nothing into the world, so we cannot take anything out of it either. 8 If we have food and covering, with these we shall be content. 9 But those who want to get rich fall into temptation and a snare and many foolish and harmful desires which plunge men into ruin and destruction. 10 For the love of money is a root of all sorts of evil, and some by longing for it have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many griefs.

Giving reminds us we are stewards (Psalm 24:1; 1 Chronicles 29:11-12)
 Psalm 24:1 (NASB) ¹ The earth is the LORD'S, and all it contains, The world, and those who dwell in it.

1 Chronicles 29:11-12 (NLT2) ¹¹ Yours, O LORD, is the greatness, the power, the glory, the victory, and the majesty. Everything in the heavens and on earth is yours, O LORD, and this is your kingdom. We adore you as the one who is over all things. ¹² Wealth and honor come from you alone, for you rule over everything. Power and might are in your hand, and at your discretion people are made great and given strength.

Giving provides eternal riches (Luke 12:33; Matthew 6:19-21) Luke 12:33 (NASB) 33 "Sell your possessions and give to charity; make yourselves money belts which do not wear out, an unfailing treasure in heaven, where no thief comes near nor moth destroys. Matthew 6:19-21 (NLT2) 19 "Don't store up treasures here on earth, where moths eat them and rust destroys them, and where thieves break in and steal. 20 Store your treasures in heaven, where moths and rust cannot destroy, and thieves do not break in and steal. 21 Wherever your treasure is, there the desires of your heart will also be.

• Giving is a blessing (Luke 6:38)

Luke 6:38 (NASB) 38 "Give, and it will be given to you. They will pour into your lap a good measure—pressed down, shaken together, and running over. For by your standard of measure it will be measured to you in return."



• Giving increases faith (Philippians 4:11-13,19)
Philippians 4:11-13 (NASB) ¹¹ Not that I speak from want, for I have learned to be content in whatever circumstances I am. ¹² I know how to get along with humble means, and I also know how to live in prosperity; in any and every circumstance I have learned the secret of being filled and going hungry, both of having abundance and suffering need. ¹³ I can do all things through Him who strengthens me.

Philippians 4:19 (NASB) ¹⁹ And my God will supply all your needs according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus.

• Giving pleases God (Philippians 4:18)
Philippians 4:18 (NASB) ¹⁸ But I have received everything in full and have an abundance; I am amply supplied, having received from Epaphroditus what you have sent, a fragrant aroma, an acceptable sacrifice, well-pleasing to God.


