#### Questions

- 1. Are you a fighter or avoid controversy? Are you a talker or a listener? Are you argumentative or peace-maker?
- 2. Do you believe in a "just war?"
- 3. In the wars that were taking place in Daniel 11, what was God's involvement in the wars and what was Satan's involvement in the wars? What place did the description of James 4:1-12 dealing with wars and fighting have to illuminate the place of man's sinful nature in the wars of Daniel 11 and even today?
- 4. Read Ephesians 4:25-27 (NASB) <sup>25</sup> "Therefore, laying aside falsehood, SPEAK TRUTH EACH ONE of you WITH HIS NEIGHBOR, for we are members of one another. <sup>26</sup> BE ANGRY, AND yet DO NOT SIN; do not let the sun go down on your anger, <sup>27</sup> and do not give the devil an opportunity." Some translations say "foothold" for the word opportunity in verse 27. The Greek word is "topos" which means place. How does unresolved anger in our life give the devil a 'foothold' into our lives? How does this relate to fighting and strife?

#### Questions (continued)

- 5. Do you believe that contention and strife are increasing in these days or that society as a whole seems to be getting along better with one another?
- 6. Pastor Randy had four 'causes' of fighting taken from James 3:13-18 and James 4:1-12: Needy & Fearful / Narcissistic Selfishness / Twisted Perspective / Demanding Perfectionism. Which of these four do you come into contact with most? With least? Which one(s) do you personally struggle with?
- 7. The sermon had also four 'cures' for fighting: Drawing Near to God / Humbling Yourself before God / Resisting the Devil / Cleansing Heart and Mind. Of these four 'positive' practices which is most challenging for you? Which seems to be easier for you?

#### Questions (continued)

- 8. Does "peace" as part of the fruits of the Holy Spirit deal with only inner peace and tranquility or also social peace which would entail relationships between people and groups?
- 9. How does the wisdom of the world differ from the wisdom of God as described in 1 Corinthians 1:18-31? How does this Corinthian passage support the Scriptures of today's message in James 4:13-18?
- 10. What can you do to begin to bring more 'peace' into the world and less 'strife' into the world?
