Conclusion:

"When you begin with praise to God, a day or a circumstance is moved out of the fog of limited potential into the realm of heaven's promised purposes. Praise clears your head in the atmosphere of God's throne where one kneels. It sharpens your vision to see through the eyes of God; and it expands your soul beyond the smallness of purpose when the focus is only on self-centered concerns. Praise opens the heart to the receptivity of God's truth. Praise humbles the soul and restores child-likeness. Praise peels back pride and rips away the flesh's tendency to posture itself. We find reality on our knees. God is touched by upraised hands. Wisdom and understanding flow back into lips which first utter thanks to the Most High." - Pastor Jack Hayford



Questions

- 1. Are you frugal with your money? Are you fairly generous with your money? Are your very generous with your money? What was your family like growing up when it came to handling money and giving to others?

- 6. How does praising someone else or the Lord, relate to the concept of humility? Is it easy for you to praise others? Is it easy for you to receive praise?



- 7. What does worship mean for you on Sunday morning? What does worship mean for you in your quiet time? What images or thoughts does the word "worship" bring up in your head?
- 8. How would praising the Lord and worshiping Him impact where you seek guidance and counsel from in your daily life? What does praising the Lord and worshiping look like in your daily life?



9. Praise means to consider something worthy of honor. It is to esteem, value, or cherish a person for His virtues or accomplishments. Therefore in praising God, we can begin to praise the Lord for the following biblical themes. Which of these are you more likely to praise the Lord for in your daily quiet time or during a typical day?



- a. Praise God for His NAME Names of the Lord = God / Jesus / Holy Spirit Psalm 115:1; Is 9:6
- b. Praise God for His RIGHTEOUSNESS Psalm 35:28 God is the standard. He is right and just.
- c. Praise God for His infinite CREATION Psalm 150:2
 Praise Him for His mighty acts. All of creation is a treasure house of praise.



d. Praise God for His WORD - Psalm 19:7-11

Psalm 19 offers a helpful outline to praise our Lord in regards to His Word :

- 1) Psalm 19:7 for converting the soul
- 2) Psalm 19:7 for making wise the simple
- 3) Psalm 19:8 for rejoicing the heart
- 4) Psalm 19:8 for enlightening the eyes
- 5) Psalm 19:9 for giving us a fear of the Lord which is cleansing and enduring forever
- 6) Psalm 19:9 for giving us the judgments of the Lord which are true and righteous



Psalm 19:7-11 (NASB)⁷ The law of the LORD is perfect, restoring the soul; The testimony of the LORD is sure, making wise the simple.⁸ The precepts of the LORD are right, rejoicing the heart; The commandment of the LORD is pure, enlightening the eyes. ⁹ The fear of the LORD is clean, enduring forever; The judgments of the LORD are true; they are righteous altogether. ¹⁰ They are more desirable than gold, yes, than much fine gold; Sweeter also than honey and the drippings of the honeycomb. ¹¹ Moreover, by them Your servant is warned; In keeping them there is great reward.



10. Psalm 100 has a myriad of words that are like "praise". Read slowly through Psalm 100 and share with the group what strikes you the most about this typically "Thanksgiving" Psalm.

Psalm 100:1-5 (NASB) ¹ Shout joyfully to the LORD, all the earth.

- ² Serve the LORD with gladness; Come before Him with joyful singing.
- ³ Know that the LORD Himself is God; It is He who has made us, and not we ourselves; We are His people and the sheep of His pasture.
- ⁴ Enter His gates with thanksgiving And His courts with praise. Give thanks to Him, bless His name.
- ⁵ For the LORD is good; His lovingkindness is everlasting And His faithfulness to all generations.
