Questions

- 9. In Hebrews 6:7-8 about the parable of the field, how does this elaborate and explain Hebrews 6:4-6?
- 10. Am I flirting with the peril of falling away? Have I begun to drift dangerously near the point of no return?
- 11. As a child of God, what is needed to keep me walking near the Savior?
- 12. What exactly is God's warning to me right now?
- 13. Of the 5 takeaways that Pastor Randy ended the sermon on, which one speaks to your heart the most? Share with the group why.
